The **27th Annual Red Mass**, sponsored by the St. Thomas More Society, will be held at **6:00 P.M. on Monday, October 6, 2014 at St. Joseph’s on the Brandywine Church, 10 Old Church Road, Greenville, DE 19807.** The Homilist is Archbishop William Edward Lori of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

Among his many duties, Archbishop Lori is member of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities and the Committee on Doctrine of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. In 2011, Archbishop Lori was appointed to the chair of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty. While serving as head of that committee, he led the bishops’ campaign for religious liberty known as the *Fortnight for Freedom*. Archbishop Lori also serves as the Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus.

The title of Mr. Weigel’s lecture is the “The Mind of Pope Francis.” Mr. Weigel has written about

Pope Francis in several publications, such as *National Review Online* and the *Wall Street Journal*.

Mr. Weigel currently serves as a Distinguished Senior Fellow of the Ethics and Public Policy Center in Washington, D.C. and was the Founding President of the James Madison Foundation in Alexandria, VA.
